## February meeting notes

Forty one attended the club meeting on February 10, including two visitors. The bubble drawing was not won by member 990, and Michael Mirabela won the door prize. Treasurer Briita Ehlers and Recording Secretary Dorothy Galovich-Call read their reports. Both were approved as read. Gordon Donnell and Michael Turrini received their medals for exhibiting during 2008's National Coin Week. Don Ehlers announced the availability of raffle tickets for our coin show to be held on July 25 and 26. The raffle prizes for 2009 are one Mexican 2 Peso gold coin every hour and final prizes of a \$20 St. Gaudens Double Eagle, \$5 Liberty Half Eagle and \$2.50 Indian Head Quarter Eagle. Michael Turrini announced a pending CSNA survey, which is expected to be dispersed to each member. Participation is encouraged. Roger Lyles had a program about cherrypicking. He said a *true* cherrypick is thought to be one thing and later discovered to be something of greater rarity or value. He related stories of passing over possible varieties in bags of wheat cents, and finding an uncirculated roll of '55 double die cents. Over the years, he's also discovered an 1872 two cent, 1909 VDB cent varieties, 1830 half dime and various Bust varieties. Always one for a good story, Roger asked members to step up with their own cherrypicks, which stood in for the regular show and tell. Lylo Okamoto kicked off with a 1964 D Kennedy half with a double die reverse (DDR). Briita Ehlers showed an Al Bucher token from Knappa, Oregon. Chuck White found a 1909 S VDB cent in a bag of wheat cents. Matt Hutchison found a 1916 Mercury dime with a faint D mintmark in a bargain bin. Gordon Donnell discovered a \$20 bill with exotic serial number 69996666. Roger added a 1786 Connecticut copper Britannia post-1777 counterfeit, of which only 5 were known. Vince Lacariere closed out the group with a 1970 AU/UNC double die cent. Prizes were dispersed in order by Roger to Briita Ehlers, Matt Hutchison, Lyle Okamoto, Chuck White and Gordon Donnell. Thanks to Roger Lyles for another fun and inspiring topic. Alistair called 14 lots, including one donation lot, while Kevin Silva and Dennis Pagano ran the items. Bruce Caires found gold in the raffle.



February 24 drew 35 with no recorded visitors. The bubble drawing was won by Ron Ikebe and the door prize went to Briita Ehlers. Briita and Dorothy read their reports, which were accepted as read. President Alistair Skinner announced the successful results of our audit by Dennis Pagano and Jim Barton. Announcements consisted of upcoming events (elsewhere in this newsletter) and the availability of raffle tickets. Show and tell returned with: Chuck Call, ten 8 ounce gold-plated silver round year set depicting the current gold design; Tommy Cuckler, 1939 Ireland half crown; Cliff Sherman, AU 1900 Morgan dollar; Don Barsi, Washington Carlisle Lumber 25 cent token and NY 10 cent Fascination Electric Bingo token; Michael Claassen, Greek 1912 20 Lepta with Athena and 1930 20 Drachma with Poseidon; Ken Barr, 5.7 ounce silver 1978 Panama proof set (Balboa); Gary Acquistapace, Columbia and Montevideo, Uruguay coin sets; Chuck White, 1937 Paul Bunyan elongated cent; and Briita Ehlers, "NJ gift" love token on necklace with "BE" engraving. Chuck Call won the show and tell drawing. After the break, Alistair Skinner called 15 lots, including one donation lot, while the Claassen brothers (Michael and Jacob) ran the items. Dennis Pagano won raffle gold.

- The club will not tolerate the sale of **counterfeit** coin or currency that do not meet the requirements of the Hobby Protection Act. As a member club of the ANA, we abide by their Code of Ethics and have adopted it into our own bylaws (Article XI, Section 1), which reads as follows,

"I agree not to sell, exhibit, produce nor advertise counterfeits, copies, restrikes and reproductions of any numismatic items if their nature is not clearly indicated by the word "counterfeit," "copy," "restrrike," or "reproduction" incused in the metal or printed on the paper thereof, with the exception of items generally accepted by numismatists and not in any way misrepresented as genuine."

This applies not only to our club auction, but also to private sales conducted at club meetings. Marking the holder or container is not sufficient for meeting the requirements of the act. Please don't sell such items at club meetings. Thanks!

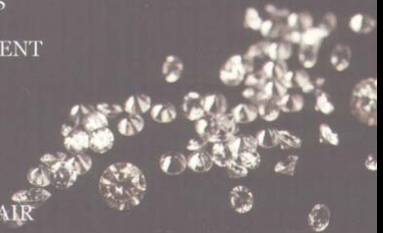
